Setting: The Tavern of the Inn

To the right are a few empty tables and chairs. Some of the chairs have been placed upside-down on the table. WIFE wipes off a table with a rag. When she finishes, INNKEEPER places chairs upside down on the table. NARRATOR stands in the left front corner.

NARRATOR: Late one night, a weary merchant arrived at the tavern of an inn.

MERCHANT enters from left, carrying many full sacks. He knocks on a door.

[Sound effect: Door Knocking]

MERCHANT: Hello? Might I come in for a bite to eat.

WIFE: We're closed.

MERCHANT: I promise, I won't trouble you long. Just a quick bite of bread or...

INNKEEPER: You heard my wife, we are closed for the night.

MERCHANT: Oh please, good people, I've travelled such a long way and my bags are so heavy. I was foolish to carry so much at one time. But I couldn't decide which of my wares to bring to the palace market. Golden goblets? Silver dishes? Fine silk? Exotic spices? So, I just brought them all.

INNKEEPER: I don't care if you're carrying a herd of elephants, we're not opening our door for—

WIFE rushes past INNKEEPER and lets MERCHANT in.

WIFE: Do come in! Please, have a seat. Set those heavy bags down. (exits stage. Calls from off stage) How about a nice bowl of herb (pronounced ERB) soup?

MERCHANT sets bags down at the table and lowers a seat from the table and sits down.

MERCHANT: Sounds perfect.

WIFE: (from off-stage) Oh, it is.

WIFE returns carrying a large pot with a ladle in it, and bowl with a spoon in it in her other hand.

INNKEEPER: (whispers to WIFE) What are you doing? Our soup today was onion.

WIFE scrapes pot with ladle and spoons it into the bowl.

WIFE: So it was, and there's just enough for one last bowl. We just need to add a dash of our special ingredient: forgetful herb. (reaches into her apron pocket and pulls out a small bag of herbs, sprinkles some into the bowl) Anyone who eats this herb forgets something. With the merchant carrying so many bags, he's bound to forget one of them. Then, whatever is inside is ours.

INNKEEPER: You are so very clever.

WIFE: I know.

WIFE serves MERCHANT the bowl of soup. MERCHANT begins eating.

WIFE: Eat up. You'll need every last spoonful for the long journey ahead.

MERCHANT: Thank you. You are too kind.

WIFE: (smiles) Not at all.

WIFE and INNKEEPER walk off to the side. MERCHANT continues to eat.

INNKEEPER: I wonder which bag he'll leave behind. Perhaps the golden goblets?

WIFE: I bet the silver dishes are so polished I can see myself in them.

INNKEEPER: Then again, my taste buds are craving the exotic spices. It would be nice to be able to season our food with more than onion (continuing in a whisper) or forgetful herb.

As WIFE and INNKEEPER talk, MERCHANT finishes his soup, picks up his bags and leaves.

WIFE: (Clutches her apron) Can't you just see me dressed in silk instead of these rags?

WIFE twirls around, then notices MERCHANT has left.

WIFE: He's gone. Time to claim our forgotten treasure.

INNKEEPER looks under the table. WIFE crawls on the floor. They find nothing.

WIFE: I don't understand. He must have forgotten something.

INNKEEPER looks down at the table, shakes his head and frowns.

INNKEEPER: Oh, he did. He forgot to pay us for his soup.

NARRATOR: Their greed had left them with nothing. And that was a lesson they never forgot.
