Every year, on July 4th, people celebrate the birth of the United States of America. How the country came about is an interesting story!


The people who came to the New World from Great Britain in the 1700s were called **colonists**. The colonists had some ideas for the New World. They had ideas how to make life better. They also wanted to make the government better. The king of Great Britain, King George, did not agree with these new ideas and expected the colonists to continue following his rules.

One of those rules was that the colonists had to take care of British soldiers. They had to feed the soldiers and give them a place to sleep. The colonists did not want to share their homes with soldiers.

Another rule was that they had to pay extra taxes but did not get anything for that money. The colonists did not want to pay the extra money for things like tea. In fact, they got so mad that they threw a bunch of tea into the water! This was known as the Boston Tea Party, and it made Great Britain very angry. The Boston Tea Party was the last straw for Great Britain.

The colonists were not happy and wanted to separate from Great Britain. They knew they would have to win their freedom. The two sides had a big battle in Massachusetts. This was just one battle of the Revolutionary War.

When the Revolutionary War ended, the colonies had a new name, The United States of America. Without the people in the New World standing up for what they believed in, the United States would not exist.
