Lizards, larger insects, and birds like to eat butterflies.	The pupa wiggles the chrysalis to scare away predators.
The new butterfly's wings are soft and folded when it emerges.	The mother butterfly lays her eggs on leaves the caterpillars like to eat.
A hungry bird lands close to a chrysalis.	Butterflies use camouflage, large eye spots, and mimicry to avoid being eaten.
When the caterpillars hatch they will be hungry and need food.	The caterpillar sheds its skin or "molts" several times as it grows.
The caterpillar grows quickly, but its skin does not stretch or grow.	The butterfly pumps blood into its wings to help them work.
