

Symbols of a Country

Symbols show pride. They stand for a country. One type of symbol is a flag. Each flag is unique. People wave the flag. It shows respect. Flags are treated with honor.



Countries have anthems. An anthem is a song. People learn the words. Anthems are sung at special times. They show support for a country. There are other special songs about countries, too. They are patriotic songs. People like to sing these songs. This means they are loyal.
