## Remember...

- Core values refer to those fundamental beliefs and ideals that guide your behavior and thoughts.
- Character traits describe your private, internal compass and assets of your personal behavior.
- <u>Personality traits</u> describe the public, external behaviors others experience when interacting with you.
- <u>Talents</u> are those gifts, skills, and strengths that better help you reach new milestones when pursuing certain activities or tasks.
- <u>Passions</u> are those topics of such interest to you that they are able to fire you into action and exploration.

Please type up your ranked, itemized list at this time and submit it this weekend in Archie under the assignment titled "My Strengths, Passions, & Values." To help you start to brainstorm about yourself, please find a long, but not exhaustive, list of adjectives

Remember, your final list should reflect those positive aspects of your quintessential self. It is important that your list be authentic, genuine, and exemplify those positive aspects of the real <u>YOU</u>! Do <u>not</u> settle on items that do not define <u>YOU</u> just because you think those are what an admission's officer wants to see. Remember, admissions officers are <u>not</u> looking to admit students who all have the same set of characteristics. That would make for a boring, unidimensional atmosphere. They are looking, instead, to put together a freshman class rich in diversity of personalities, talents, interests, values, dreams, and goals.

Remember too, you should be able to articulate several examples and anecdotes from your life that exemplify your final list of 5-10 personal strengths, passions, and personal values. If you create an inauthentic list - *if you fake it* - you will soon find yourself struggling to find clear and strong examples in your life that can be used to showcase these aspects of your being.

Inauthenticity, thus, quickly results in superficial, flat, unconvincing, and lackluster college application essays that, not only are untruthful, but don't impress, don't move the reader, and lack memorability. Authenticity speaks loudly and you all have wonderful traits, viewpoints, interests, and dreams to share. Though a list of the potential interests each of you may hold would be unending, please find below some examples of traits and of core values that you may find useful.
