REASONS

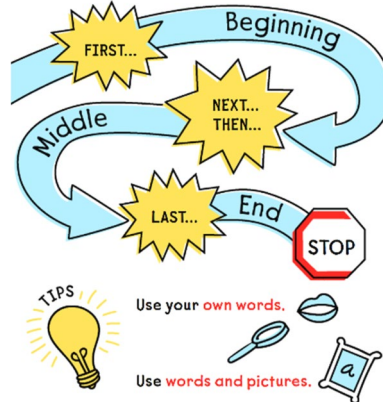
What reasons support the opinion? Look for facts, or things that can be proved.
