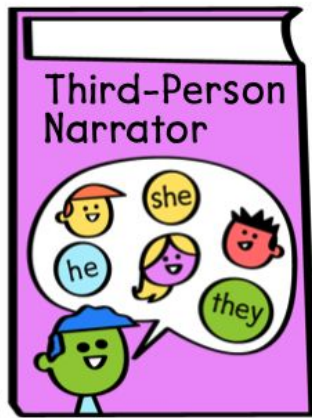

VOCABULARY

invited-when you have been asked to come
screams-yells loudly
plead-asking in a strong, hopeful way
musical-has a tune
shove-to push something hard
scoots-moves very quickly
greedy-wanting more than what is fair
scurries-moving with short, fast steps

Point of View

The narrator is the person who tells a story. Readers see the story events through the narrator's point of view.



A story written in first-person point of view has a character in the story as the narrator. Look for a narrator who uses the words **I**, **me**, or **my**.

A story written in third-person point of view has an outside narrator. The narrator uses the words **he**, **she**, or **they**. An outside narrator can tell about all the characters.

Generative Vocabulary 3.3

Prefixes **un-**, **re-**

A **prefix** is a word part added to the beginning of a **base word** that changes the meaning of the word. The prefix **un-** means "not" or "to reverse."

The prefix **re-** means "again."

- **uninvited**
- **reinvited**



You can look up base words you do not know in the dictionary.

Examples

- lock
re + lock = **relock**
un + lock = **unlock**
- tie
re + tie = **retie**
un + tie = **untie**
- happy
un + happy = **unhappy**
- build
re + build = **rebuild**

Vocabulary Strategy 3.4

Context Clues

Ask questions to figure out the meaning of a word you do not know. Then look for clues to answer your questions. The clues are called **context clues**.

Fill the **pitcher** with milk.

Examples

- We are **helpful** when we rake leaves.
- Candles, flashlights, and lamps **illuminated** the dark room.
- I am always **amused** by Rory's funny drawings.
