Include:

- Allies and enemies
- Cultural information
- Trading Partners
- Your country's geographic location, esp. its proximity to the nation in question
- Any voting blocs, economic blocs, or regional blocs, your nation is a part of

- a usually temporary grouping within a legislature, made up of diverse countries acting together for a common interest or purpose
