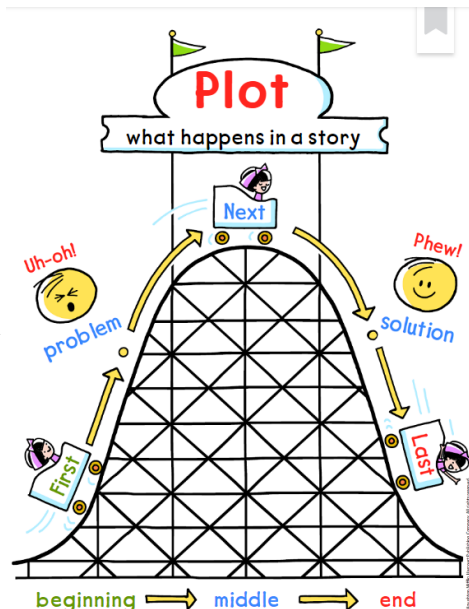

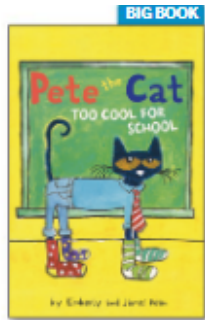

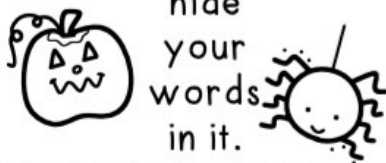

Teach the Word

- 1 Say the word. Ask children to repeat it.
- 2 Explain the meaning. *The **shell** of an animal is the hard covering on the outside of its body that protects it.*
- 3 Talk about examples.

Use the Image *A snail can hide in its **shell** if it senses danger.*

Make Connections Guide children to name different animals that have **shells**, such as turtles, crabs, clams, and armadillos.
