

Suffixes -y, -ly

A **suffix** is a word part added to the end of a base word that changes the meaning of the word. The suffix **-y** means "having or being like something." The suffix **-ly** explains how or when something is done.

Examples

- 1 sleep
sleep + y = **sleepy**
- 2 smell
smell + y = **smelly**
- 3 proud
proud + ly = **proudly**
- 4 light
light + ly = **lightly**


Picture This!
