Critical Vocabulary

- 1 video** The word **video** describes a recording of movements and actions that you can see on a television or computer screen. *Last night we watched a video about two people sailing around the world.*
- 2 hydrant** A **hydrant** is an outdoor pipe firefighters use to get water to put out fires. *The firefighters attached a thick hose to the hydrant so they could put out the fire.*
- 3 block** A **block** is a section of a community with streets on all of its sides. *On the block where I live, all the neighbors know each other.*
- 4 costumes** **Costumes** are special clothes that people may wear to pretend that they are from another time or place. *The play is set in the 1920s, so we are wearing costumes from that period.*

When people **march**, they walk with even steps, often in a group. *The band members who will march in the parade must stay in step and stay in tune.*
