

## Homework #1 on “Unit 0: Intro to Philosophy”

The first five questions are *reading comprehension* questions, so answers to those questions are either *true* or *false*. Yet, last two questions are *opinion-based* questions, and opinions are either *well-explained* or *poorly-explained*, so you'll be graded on the basis of how well you explain (and defend) your opinion. Note: It doesn't matter whether or not you agree with Bertrand Russell, and the opinion-based questions are your opportunity to say whether or not you agree with him (and explain why you do or don't agree with him).

1. According to Bertrand Russell, what's the difference between science and theology?

2. According to Bertrand Russell, how are theology and philosophy alike?

3. According to Bertrand Russell, how are science and philosophy alike?

4. According to Bertrand Russell, what's the difference between science and philosophy?

5. According to Bertrand Russell, what's the difference between philosophy and theology?

6. OPINION: Do you agree with Russell's distinction between theology, philosophy, and science? Why or why not? Explain.

7. OPINION: In your opinion, are science and religion always in conflict with each other? Why or why not? Explain. (Note: If they're not always in conflict with each other, then how are they compatible?)
