When?

- Before reading
- During reading

Why?

- To get information
- To help you understand the text
- To practice being "awake" and thinking while reading
- To be curious and wonder as you read



How?

Use question words to **ASK**:
who what where
why when how



Look around in the text and pictures for evidence, or details, to help you **ANSWER**.

SETTING

WHERE

Where does the story happen?



WHEN

When does the story take place?

Vocabulary Strategy 1.4

Antonyms

Antonyms are words that have opposite meanings.

- Dad **bellowed** to us.
- Dad **whispered** to us.

Bellowed and **whispered** are antonyms because the words have opposite meanings.

Examples



- 1 Why do you look **serious**?
Why do you look **joyful**?
- 2 The door is **open**.
The door is **closed**.
- 3 This rock is very **bumpy**.
This rock is very **smooth**.

Review Subjects and Predicates

The **subject** of a sentence is the naming part. It tells who or what did or does something.

The **predicate** of a sentence is the action part. It tells what the subject did or does.

Subject

Pam walks her dog.
The boy chooses a pet.

Predicate

The dogs **pull on a rope**.
Ben **plays with his dog**.
