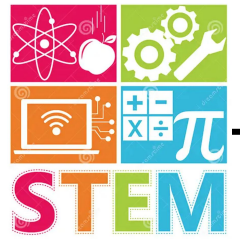

Observation vs. Inference WS

Often assumptions and inferences should be avoided, and great care should be taken to limit one's conclusions about behavior to what we have observed rather than forming interpretations of what we have observed.
