

## Unit I Assignment

1. Read Chapter 6 pages 162-183 in *American Odyssey*. Complete the Chapter 6 guided readings for section 1 and section 2. The guided reading is posted under assignments.
2. Read Chapter 1 in *Gateway to EOC*. Complete the Chapter 1 identifications. These are found on the first page of the chapter. The IDs must be legible and paraphrased in your own words or points will be deducted. State the significance, importance or contribution of the individual or term. Try to relate or make as many connections as possible for each term. Plagiarized ids will receive a grade of zero. Here is an example of an identification:  
Battle of Horseshoe Bend/Andrew Jackson 1814  
During the War of 1812, Andrew Jackson overcame near mutiny by his own militia to defeat the Creek nation at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend. This victory shaped public policy in that the power of the Creeks was crushed in the south, and they were unable to resist white expansion into their territory. In the area of diplomacy, the victorious Jackson went on to seize control of Pensacola which weakened Spanish control over Florida. Politically, Jackson became a national hero and was launched towards the presidency. His animosity to Native Americans would shape his policies as president.
3. Complete competency goal 1 questions (1-1a) and competency 2 goal questions (1-11) in the EOC Review Packet posted under assignments. All questions should be answered using complete sentences. No bullets or fragments will be accepted. Make sure you address all parts of each question.
4. Create two timelines. The first should cover the time period (1840-1861) and include the events leading to sectional conflict. The second should cover the time period (1861-1865) and include events during the civil war. The timelines should be chronological.
5. Analyze the image on the course home page. What do all the words have in common (theme)? How can you connect them to what you have learned in class? Responses should thoroughly consider the topics discussed in class and fully examine the image and make connections.
