Once done reading, answer the questions below:

1. What do the figures in the wallpaper represent? Why did the narrator tear down the paper?
2. How would "The Yellow Wallpaper" be different if it were told from John's point of view? What is the significance of the first-person perspective of the narrative?
3. What is the theme and tone of the story? What does the repetition of the phrase "What can one do?" add to that?
4. In what ways might the ending of the story be seen as both a victory and a defeat for the narrator? Predict what would happen to our narrator after the story
