Begin with the Essay numbered A1, and answer the following questions on a loose leaf sheet of paper, and bring it to class on Tuesday.

1. What Total score was essay A1 given?
2. What did it score in each category? Purpose/Structure? Development? Language?
3. What is the maximum you can score in each of these categories?
4. What is the maximum you can score in total?
5. Did Essay A1 receive a good score or a bad score?
6. Why do you think that the student received that score? Explain.
7. Read Essay A2. What Score did it get in each category? What was the total score?
8. How did Essay A2 compare to A1?
9. What's the biggest thing that jumps out at you about these 2 essays (A1 and A2)?
10. What advice would you give these 2 students?

5. In the essay A4, the student does not use formal language. What word or words indicate this? What words should the student have used instead?

4. What were the areas that needed improvement? What did the student do wrong that they can improve upon?
5. Read A9. What did that one score? Why do you think it scored higher than A7? What did this student do differently from student A7?
6. Is there anything that this student did that stood out to you, that makes you think, "I should do something like this too?" Explain.
