1. According to Socrates, if nothing is ever false, then why do Dionysodorus & Euthydemus have a problem?

2. According to Socrates and Cleinias, what is philosophy? (See page 35 in Unit 16.)

3. According to Cleinias, the art of war is *not* the knowledge that is necessary for happiness. (See pages 35–36 in Unit 16.)

(i) According to Cleinias, warfare is a type of what?

(ii) According to Cleinias, politics is a type of what?

(iii) According to Cleinias, hunting is not as important as cooking. Hence by analogy, which art did he think is more important than the art of war?

(iv) According to Cleinias, what is the art of politics?

(v) In Book 4 of Plato's *Republic*, Socrates shared his opinion about what wisdom is. (See page 29 in Unit 12.) According to Socrates (in Book 4 of Plato's *Republic*), what is wisdom?

4. According to Dionysodorus, did he know how many teeth his brother Euthydemus had? Why or why not? Explain.

5. According to Socrates, why shouldn't Euthydemus and Dionysodorus demonstrate their art in public?
