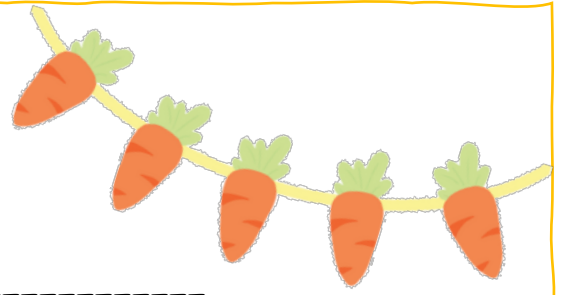

#### Point of View

The narrator is the person who tells a story. Readers see the story events through the narrator's point of view.

**WHO tells the story?**

THIRD-PERSON NARRATOR	FIRST-PERSON NARRATOR
A person who is <b>NOT</b> in the book is telling it. Look for the words <b>he, she, or they</b> .	A person who is <b>in</b> the book is telling it. Look for the words <b>I, me, or my</b> .

#### IDEAS and SUPPORT

When authors write to persuade, they want readers to do or believe something.

**OPINION**  
What does the author think or feel?

**REASONS**  
What reasons support the opinion? Look for facts, or things that can be proved.

**EXAMPLES**  
What examples or details tell more about the reasons?

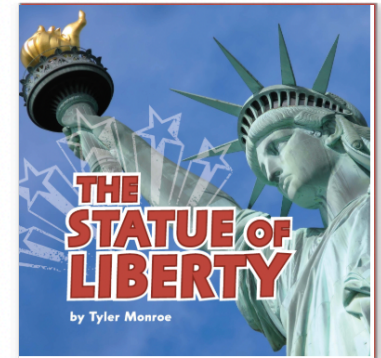




1 If we were going to plan a trip, we would need to choose a ride. Let's say we can choose to go by ship or by plane. Which one do you think would be best for our trip?

2 Because ships float, a ship needs no tires. Ships aren't fast, but lots of people like to sail away on ships for fun. We can ride inside the ship, and we can stand, sit, or even jog on top of it! We can see the sea gulls flying in the sky! The ship will likely have a swimming pool and other places to relax or play. A ship is so big that it has shops inside. It has windows too!



3 A plane is smaller than a ship. It has tires, but it only uses them to take off and to land. A plane has wings, but they don't flap. A plane will fly high in the sky. It's quicker to fly than to float. We go inside and sit to ride on a plane. Unlike a ship, we cannot ride on top of a plane! Inside the plane, we have to be seated. We can't get out of our seats to play. We can't get up and shop. There are no shops on a plane! We can sit and look out of the windows at the sky.

4 What if the ride frightens us, and we want to get off the ship? We can't jump off the ship. We can't get off until it is safely docked.

5 What if the flight frightens us, and we want to get off the plane? We can't jump out of the plane. We can't get off until it safely lands.

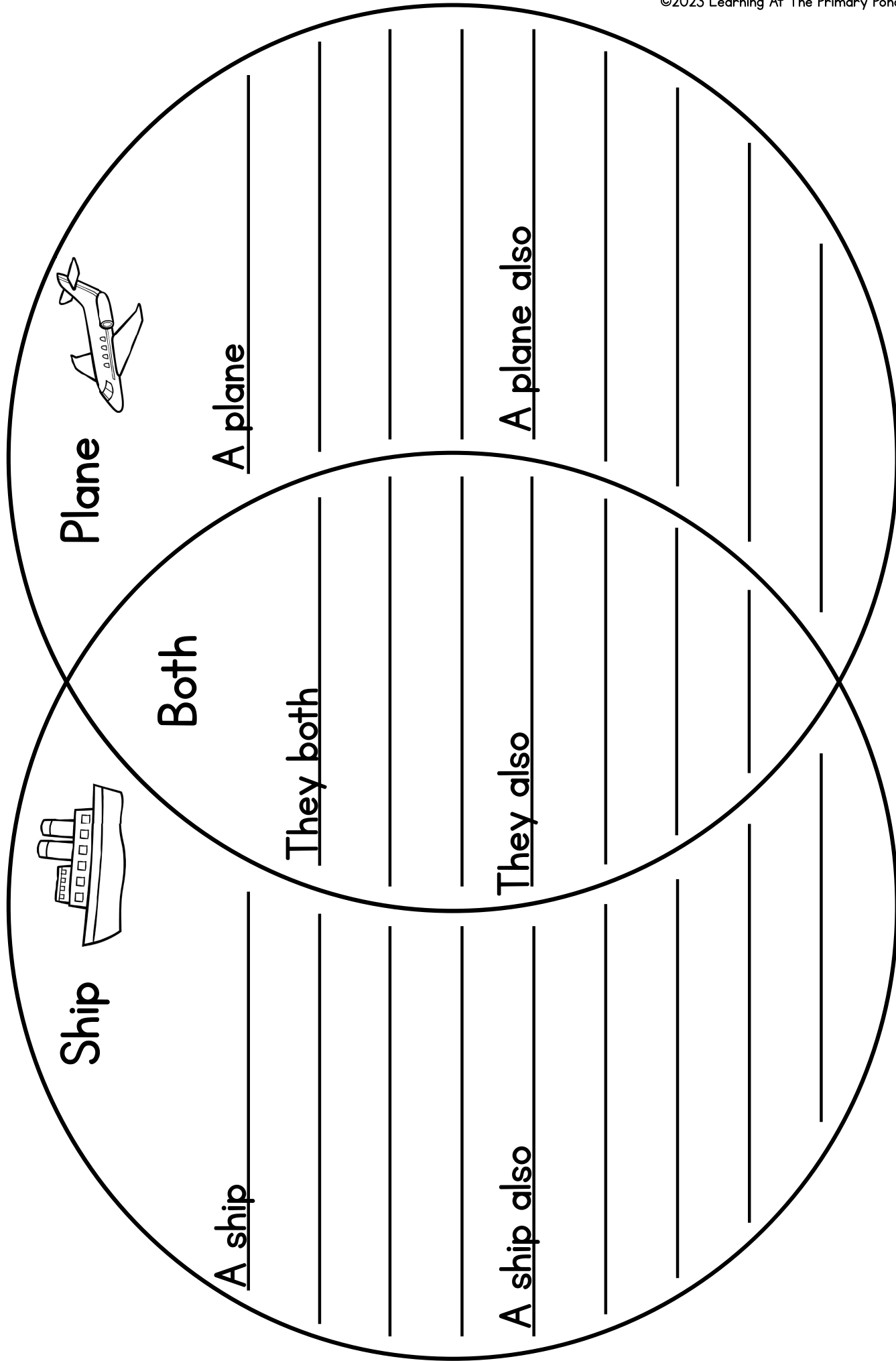


6 When you wait for the plane to land or the ship to dock, you will be let off. Then your feet will be on land. You may be glad or you may be sad when it's time to go!
