- At the end of the Greek Dark Ages, the two main styles of Ancient Greek column were the Doric Order and the Ionic Order. Of the three columns depicted below, one of them is Doric, and another one of them is Ionic, but yet another one of them is neither Doric nor Ionic. Which is which?— Label each column as ‘Ionic’, ‘Doric’, or ‘neither’.



- Homer and Hesiod were the two most influential Ancient Greek epic poets.

- (i) What dialect of Ancient Greek did they use for their epic poems?
- (ii) What was their native dialect of Greek? In other words, what dialect of Greek did they most likely speak in everyday speech since they were children?

4. The Asiatic Greek colonies were the Greek colonies in Anatolia (*i.e.* Asia Minor). In the map below, look at the Greek colonies in Anatolia (*i.e.* Asia Minor), which is the tan-colored region on the map (rather than the green-colored or reddish-colored regions). On the map below, **circle** and **label** the Asiatic Greek regions of *Aeolia*, *Ionia*, and *Doris*. Even though you don't have to be razor-thin precise, do your best to at least broadly indicate the general locations of the 3 regions. (Hint: In the map on page 36 of Chapter 2, look for the main islands and/or coastal cities in *Aeolia*, *Ionia*, and Asiatic *Doris*.)
