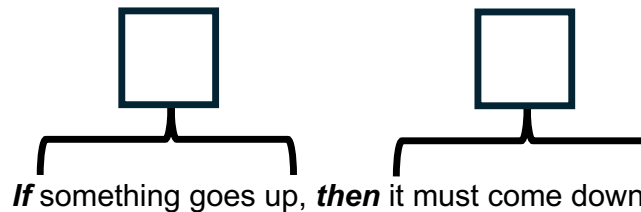
Section 1. Checkmark
