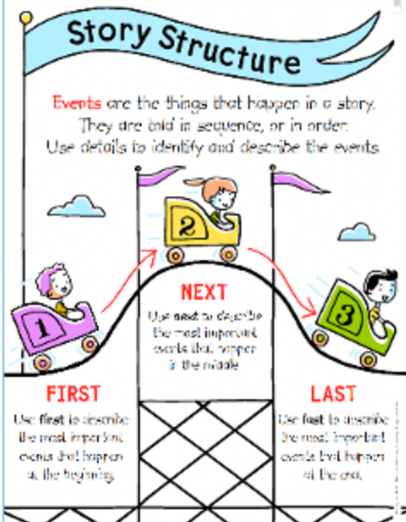

RHYME

Words end with the same sound or sounds.

CAT SAT

REPETITION

The same words or lines are said over and over and over and over and over...

ALLITERATION

Words near each other start with the same sound or sounds.

Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.

Author's Purpose

Why do authors write?

They have one of these purposes. It's as easy as PIE to remember...



PERSUADE
The author tries to persuade readers to agree or to do something.



INFORM
The author gives facts and information about a topic.



ENTERTAIN
The author writes for readers to enjoy.

How can you figure out the author's purpose?

- FIRST** look for clues about the genre.
- THEN** ask questions about what you read and find answers.

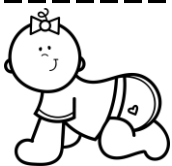
