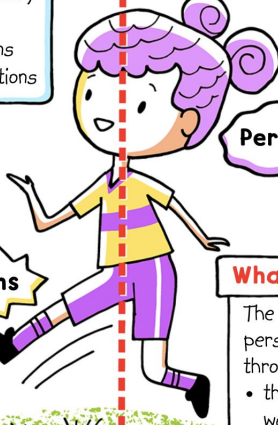

Generative Vocabulary 1.8

Inflections -ed, -ing

Add **-ed** to the end of a **verb** to tell about an action that already happened. Add **-ing** to tell what is happening or will happen.



jump + ed = **jumped**
jump + ing = **jumping**

Examples

- 1 past = we **planned**
present = we are **planning**
future = we will be **planning**
- 2 past = riders **turned**
present = riders are **turning**
future = riders will be **turning**

Review Kinds of Sentences

A **statement** is a sentence that tells something. It ends with a period. A **question** asks something. It ends with a question mark. A **command** gives an order. It tells someone to do something. It ends with a period. An **exclamation** shows strong feeling. It ends with an exclamation point.

Statement	A firefighter puts out fires.
Question	How do you become a doctor?
Command	Find out how police officers train.
Exclamation	Nurses are so brave!

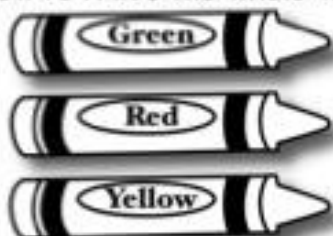
Apple Words
