## Labor Day

**WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY**



Labor Day is a time when friends and families gather for end of summer celebrations. Some people take a final vacation to the shore. Others attend parades or enjoy a backyard cook out. But there is more to Labor Day than late summer fun. Labor is a **national** holiday celebrated on the first Monday of September. The holiday honors the American labor movement , when unions fought for fair working conditions for all **laborers** in our country.

In the 19<sup>th</sup> century, many workers faced very harsh working conditions. They were often forced to work 10-12 hour days in **grueling** conditions, with very little pay. Even young children were **subjected** to working in dangerous factories and coal mines. When workers became fed up with these working conditions, they organized themselves into labor **unions**, who fought for better working conditions and higher pay. They also fought to protect young children, by rallying for an age limit of employees.

In 1872, a carpenter named Peter McGuire organized a strike of more than 10,000 workers who marched through the streets of New York City, calling for better working conditions. Ten years, McGuire **proposed** a special holiday for workers who paraded through the streets of New York City on September 5, 1882. However, some **controversy** exists about who founded the first Labor Day. Some people believe it was not Peter McGuire, but a union secretary named Matthew

McGuire who first proposed the holiday. Despite the uncertainty of its origin, in 1894 Congress voted to declare Labor Day a national holiday. President Grover Cleveland signed this into a law in order to gain the support of trade unions. The celebration of the first holiday involved a street parade followed by festivals in honor of workers and their families. In later years, speeches made by **prominent** workers became part of Labor Day events.

Today many people consider Labor Day to be the unofficial end of summer. (Summer officially ends during the September Equinox, occurring between September 21-24.) People often gather for parades, parties, and late summer fun. Many schools **resume** classes around this time, allowing students to enjoy one more long holiday weekend before the rush of the school year. In addition, many fall sports begin during labor day weekend. So enjoy Labor Day weekend by having fun with your family and friends, but remember that this holiday holds a special meaning to workers throughout our county.
