1. 2.2 GUIDED NOTES with answers for self-checking (located on page 2 of this substitute plan)
 - a. Students will check the answers they recorded in their notebooks and make corrections as needed.
 - b. REMEMBER: the act of writing and reading are forms of studying. As you are making corrections, you are studying, and it helps this information go into your long term memory. So, as you do this activity “get in the zone” and “focus in”. Eventually and soon enough, the Ch. 2 Test will come & doing this will help immensely.

2.2 Part 1

1. The Portuguese were the leaders of early exploration in the 1400s.
2. They hoped to find a new trade route to India and China.
3. Henry the Navigator, laid the groundwork for a new era of exploration.
4. Ships sailed along the coast of West Africa, AKA, the Gold Coast.
5. They traded for gold, ivory, and slaves in the mid-1400s.
6. In 1487, Bartholomeu Dias explored the southernmost part of Africa.
7. In 1498, Vasco da Gama reached India.

2.2 Part 2

1. Long before Western European explorers, Vikings reached North America: Iceland & Greenland in the 800s & 900s C.E.
2. 1492 C.E. Queen Isabella of Spain sponsored Columbus on his 1st voyage. He set out with 3 ships to find route to Asia.
3. Oct. 1492, he found San Salvador (Bahamas) & claimed it for Spain. He didn't know he had reached the Americas. He thought he had reached the East Indies.
4. Later, he explored Hispaniola, Cuba, and Jamaica & sailed along the coasts of Central America & northern South America. He claimed these lands for Spain.
5. Treaty of Tordesillas was signed by Spain & Portugal to clarify the line of demarcation between their lands in the Americas.
6. Amerigo Vespucci mapped South America's coastline, 1499, & concluded it a continent, but not part of Asia. European geographers called it America in his honor.
7. Spain claimed the Pacific and adjoining lands.
8. Ferdinand Magellan's crew was the first to circumnavigate the world.
