

## Announcements #2 for Ethics Olympiad

### TEAM A

**Assignment:** Please complete Case 1 and Case 3 by Thursday. For Case 3, I suggest using Kensi's ideas as your starting point. Also, make sure to read the notes I left toward the bottom of the case, after the questions—they'll help guide your responses.

**Tip:** Don't hesitate to reuse key phrases or structures from other questions in the same case. That's actually expected, since your answers should follow the same framework. For example, in your second case, your responses to Questions 1 and 2 will likely share the same structure and many of the same keywords. Have those frameworks interchangeable and readily presentable. Also, don't be afraid to scroll up and look at your shared reasons for other questions.

### TEAM B

**Assignment:** Please complete Case 2 and Case 3 by Thursday. For case 2, you must provide a framework and keywords.

**Tip:** I've given you a way to be able to clean up your work in Case 1. I think what I wrote is full proof. As I said to Team A, don't hesitate to reuse key phrases or structures from other questions in the same case. That's actually expected, since your answers should follow the same framework. For example, in your first case, your responses to Questions 1 can lend a hand to other questions thereby making your response longer.

### BOTH TEAMS

1) For the introduction, please don't forget to state who the stakeholders are. You say something like "The stakeholders of the case are..."

Stakeholders by the way are those who are affected by the case. Who is affected by your dilemma? For example, in the Elon Musk name case:

*"In this case, the stakeholders are those children whose names are in question, the parents who name their children, and the society who may or may not judge their namesakes"*
