Your Task

Choose **one (1)** character from *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* and create a **trifold poster** all about them! You'll show what you've learned about your character by describing their **appearance, personality, quotes, and your favorite scene**—plus your own **illustration**. Write everything neatly in a draft in your journal and then transfer to the Tri-fold poster.



What to Include on Your Trifold

1. Physical Traits

Describe what your character looks like:

- Age or how old they seem
- Species (human, animal, mythical creature, etc.)
- Clothes or accessories
- Any other important details about their appearance

2. Character Traits

Explain what your character is like on the inside:

- How do they act or behave?
- What kind of person are they (brave, kind, sneaky, loyal, etc.)?
- What are their feelings, goals, or fears?

3. Dialogue (2 Quotes)

Choose **two quotes** (things your character says) from the book that show their personality or how they feel. Write each quote and explain **what it shows** about them.

4. Favorite Scene

Describe your **favorite scene** in the book that includes this character.

- What happens in the scene?
- Why is it your favorite?
- What does it tell us about the character?

5. Illustration

Draw or include a neat, colorful **illustration** of your character.
