Extra Credit Opportunity

This assignment is fully optional and can only help you. Even if you do “bad” on this, it just won’t boost your grade as much. So PLEASE follow the few directions I give here as you complete this easy A.

Directions: Put your creative hats on and make a series of either memes, edits, pictures, comics, a short story or a poem about any topic related to absolute or relative age dating (things from chapter 5). We will review them and vote on our favorites together and I’ll give the winners from each class a prize so do your best! Make sure you do the following:

- All submissions must be **SCHOOL APPROPRIATE**. If you wouldn’t want me to show your meme to Mr. Kertesz, Mr. Demopoulos, or your parents, then don’t send it.
- You must explain, either directly in the submission or verbally to the class, the scientific principal it relates to from the chapter. For example: if you make a meme about trilobites, you need to explain what they are and how they relate to topics we’ve learned.
- The information should be *accurate*. Don’t make up scientific information like how old things are. If you’re being creative in a story sense, that’s ok. For example: if you are making a story about the life of a trilobite, you can make up what he is doing and his personality, but it should accurately relate to how old trilobites are and when they would have inhabited the Earth.
- One short story, self-drawn comic, or poem is enough, and **they must be handwritten** (can be done on goodnotes).
- If making an edit/video, it should be 30 seconds or longer for it to count. You can do multiple short ones to get up to 30 seconds total if desired. ***No sora AI videos or anything similar***. You must do more than just type a sentence into a program.
- Memes/pictures like the example in your notes can use popular formats that already exist, **but I shouldn’t be able to google and find the exact thing you submit**. Make something new, and you **need at least 3 total to count**.
