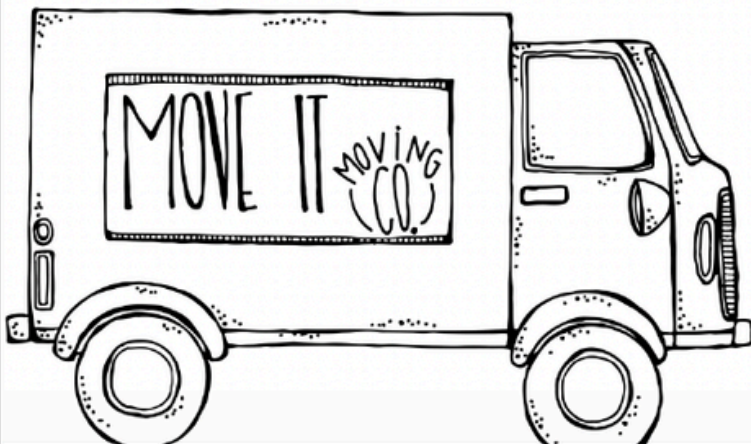
② The night before the move, I couldn't sleep. I was so anxious about what the next day would bring. I had no idea what to expect. The only thing I knew was that everything was going to be different.

## Summertime Color By Number #2: Synonyms

# Thursday

Color **RED** if the word is a synonym for: smart, dangerous

Color **ORANGE** if the word is a synonym for: spoiled, fortunate, active, create, hideous

Color **YELLOW** if the word is a synonym for: untamed, immense, terrified, peculiar, fracture, look, conceal

Color **GREEN** if the word is a synonym for: accurate

Color **LIGHT BLUE** if the word is a synonym for: ancient, brave, mourn, ruin, frigid, rapid, divide, change, mistake, help, receive, connect, content, permit

Color **BLUE** if the word is a synonym for: recommend, definitely, depart, tasty, skinny, clean, dirty, truthful, damp, compliment, outcome, choice, perhaps, original

Color **PURPLE** if the word is a synonym for: strong, grateful, exhausted, accomplish, halt, miniscule, climb, soar, cut, humorous, hurt, despise, bother

Color **WHITE** if the word is a synonym for: furious, inquire

Color **BROWN** if the word is a synonym for: repair, scowl, image, pail, swap, build, slippery, gather

Color **PINK** if the word is a synonym for: boring, sick
